It's not about us, we're only trying for the light beaming somewhere to make an imprint. In the right moment – for ever, perhaps – in glass and in such manner to make you grasp for air and blind with astonishment: "What beauty!"

Those years were truly dismal. I mean that peculiar sensation of standing on the other side of time which plagued the people of the former Czechoslovak Socialist Republic. Apart from the occasional niceties, a few good ideas, family, friends and a touch of beauty, we were steeped up to our noses in apathy, lies, and foulness. But due to the fact that it was during those years that we, sequestered in our minds and talking in hushed voices, experienced our first puppy loves and went to our first underground rock concerts, the allure of this era, despite all its monstrosity, still lingers on. Whoever was so inclined could simply find out for themselves what is and isn't right, what is and isn't true, and what is and is not beautiful. This knowledge was certainly not gained easy, and many turned tail at the prospect. It was during this time, a time when even our founder was living out those awkward years when the outside world mediated only through tabloid youth mags and VHS movies, that the foundations of Lasvit were quietly being laid down.

Just as we are fascinated with contemporary daily life, a time which we in Lasvit try to make magical by bringing a touch of beauty to the otherwise dull daily humdrum, we continue to be fascinated with our own quotidian past. One of the iconic phenomena of those times was public catering in the so-called bufet, or automat.

For some it was an ugly place, for others a venue of communality and warmth. Whether we count ourselves among the first or second group, these cafeterias were undoubtedly a product of their times. Despite the strictly standardized meals, drinks, prices, tableware and uniforms through which the regime attempted to peddle its authority over the populace, the patrons of these hasheries were real people who met there for conversation, both solemn and frivolous, joked about politics, fell in love, nursed a hangover, or simply complained to no-one in particular. Even under the grey shadow of the socialist regime, the rich and colorful fabric of life was woven from the tiny threads of the every-day.

While working on the publication which you hold in your hands, we asked ourselves: what would it be like if the bufets would not make one eat off paper plates and dirty aluminum cutlery, but would rather ring with the sound of fine glass, supplied by the world's foremost designers? Perhaps because the real bufets have all but died out, we wanted to make this idea into a reality, and give you a taste of what it might have been like. A bit of beauty, a bit of disgust. A dash of respect, a dash of regret. Both love and hate.

Immediately following the Second World War, the Communist party gained strong influence in the newly founded Czechoslovakia, and in 1946 won the parliamentary elections. Usurping absolute power in February 1948, it set up a system modeled on the Soviet Union, including the institutionalization of central planning and of centralized industry. This system affected virtually all spheres of life, including public eating habits.

The 'bufet' or 'automat' were, in Communist Czechoslovakia, defined as "a catering center for supplementary eating and refreshment," which however did not mean that one could get, for example, a nice lunch there. These hasheries already had a long tradition in the Czech lands, and in many ways they were a continuation of Austro-Hungarian venues – old pubs, canteens and the so-called *Tschecherl*, which were cheap diners where one could get coffee, beer, or liquor. These were especially popular in the Habsburg metropolis of Vienna, and were a favorite watering hole for Czech laborers.

The most legendary of the Czechoslovak *bufets* was Automat Koruna which was situated in the very center of Prague. The word '*automat*' really fit the bill, as the soft drinks and meals were sold with the help of automatic machines. After the Second World War, these *bufets* underwent a drastic change – they became folk pubs of the lowest price range, providing accessible, cheap meals. A system of five 'price categories' was set up, and each place of public catering was assigned into one of these groups. These price groups then requested a certain product range from the state, as well as interior furnishings, and the prices on the menu reflected their level of luxury. The state was indeed very diligent in their social planning.

From the fifties onward, numerous of the so-called *bufets* sprang up, not only in the capital, but in locales all over Czechoslovakia, especially in industrial centers. A new chapter was written toward the end of the fifties as a result of the gradual change in lifestyle which the post-Stalin era brought with it. Automation once again took center stage and self-service mingled with a modern interior style. The aesthetic was, in former Czechoslovakia, called the "Brussels style," after the successful national exhibit at the 1958 World Expo in Brussels. Of course, the space age also burst into the world of *automats* and *bufets* – a fact testified to by Brno's most famous hashery, opened in 1958, which was called Sputnik.

The product range gradually expanded. Warmed sausages were especially popular. It was apparently this dish which, toward the end of the 1950s, drew a very special guest – one Antonín Zápotocký, the then-prime minister and later president of Czechoslovakia.

The automats also offered cold catering, especially the eponymous *chlebiček* (open-faced sandwich) which became somewhat of a Czech specialty. There are theories that the recipe is a Czech invention, and that Jan Paukert, the Prague-based delicatessen owner, apparently made them for the first time in 1916, attempting to fulfill the wishes of his painter friend Skramlík who requested a more filling snack for his painting sessions. The *chlebiček* was at first a rather luxurious item, but after the end of the Second World War it became popular in all social spheres. Perhaps what made it so ubiquitous was the fact that it was often offered as a sort of compensation at various political meetings where, during high socialism, people's attendance was mandatory. Sardines were apparently the first type of garnish, but soon the most favorite sort was ham with eggs and a piece of pickle, all nestled atop a mayonnaise-based potato salad. The mayo and potato salad took its inspiration from Russian cuisine.

Another favorite cold food was the so-called 'Russian egg' – these are usually hard-boiled eggs served on mayonnaise-based potato salad and a slice of ham, but the eggs in aspic were also a very popular meal. The love of Russian eggs in the *automats* led to the spread of an urban legend which said that the recipe came from the need to make use of goods and ingredients which would otherwise spoil.

But the *bufets* and *automats* mostly provided warm dishes, or at least an acceptable ersatz, and the extremely cheap soups became most popular. After a night out in the pub, there was nothing better than tripe soup, ideally served with a fresh piece of pastry, presented on a plate with a napkin underneath. It may not have been as elegant as having eggs Benedict in New York's Waldorf Hotel, but it served its purpose. The most favorite main dishes consisted of various types of goulash, hot meat loaf, and various sauces with dumplings as a side dish. During the 1950s and 1960s, it was beef which was most often on the menu, as it was cheaper and easier to acquire. Pork was valued for its high fat content, and became more frequent in the *automats* of the 1970s and 1980s. It was then that baked pork with dumplings and cabbage became a timeless Czech classic. But one does not have to eat meat all the time, and Czech cuisine had many flour-based dishes. During his 1950s visit to Prague, the Canadian historian Hubert Gordon Skilling was shocked by the fact that the local hasheries served only dumplings with sauce – for some of the patrons, meat was too expensive a luxury. It was especially in the 1970s and 1980s that so-called REMA slices made their first appearance – the acronym stood for 'reconstituted meat,' which was an ersatz sort of steak made from various cuttings. Of course, the patrons were not too pleased with this development, and after 1989, the REMA slices were quietly taken off the menu.

The selling of potato fries was considered a western import, and so their spread lagged behind. Their inclusion on the menu of the Arbat *automat* in Prague was thus taken as a sign of changes in life-style brought about by the so-called *perestroika*, and foreshadowed the arrival of American fast food chains, which indeed started popping up in the beginning of the 1990s.

Beer, of course, was an integral part of the experience, and the king of all the beverages in *bufets* and *automats* across the country. The quality of the wine, on the other hand, was so dismal that only the most devoted drinkers could brave it. The selling of hard liquor in the canteens was severely frowned upon by the authorities, as the venues were intended to serve quick refreshment, and not to make people drunk, furthermore during work hours. Nonetheless, the proprietors made the biggest profits on serving hard liquor, the most favorite spirit being the so-called 'local rum,' which was a liquor distilled from potatoes and flavored with rum aroma. Another favorite included industrial spirits like the peppermint liqueur, know as *zelená*, or 'green.' Occasionally, both these spirits would be mixed with beer – in the case of *zelená*, this constituted a devilish cocktail dubbed "the magic eye."

For those younger then 18 years, the hasheries served soft drinks. Their taste did not resemble any fruit, so you could only tell them apart by their color – yellow, red, or orange.

The automats offered an alternative to the beer bestseller – milk cocktails with fruit flavoring. The milk cocktail could, in many automats, be combined with a dessert of which they usually had quite a broad selection.

The patrons of these venues mostly consisted of laborers who often spent a large part of their work day there. Another usual demographic were seniors, as many of them were not very well off in those times. They came here for the cheap soup, or waited for some guest to leave their unfinished meal or beer on the table. Among these so-called 'bufeters' were also many young people who found themselves ostracized from mainstream society.

The bufets and automats were supposed to serve quick refreshment, so one usually ate and drank standing up. That however did not mean that you couldn't have a long and loud discussion. Quite the contrary! A whole group of laborers or students could convene around the long tables and spend a large part of their afternoon there.

The social buzzing of the hasheries, with their myriad tall-tales told over various drinks, was documented in the short stories of Bohumil Hrabal, the famous Czech writer. He has become an integral part of the socialist-era bufets and automats, just like Jaroslav Hašek, the author of *The Good Soldier Švejk*, before him was a fixture of Prague's pre-war pub culture. After all, one of Hrabal's most famous novels is called *Automat Svět* (A Hashery Called World) – this automat in fact existed and the writer was a frequent patron there.

The automats were venues mostly for the lower classes, but occasionally they also hosted visitors of higher stature – doctors, engineers, or higher apparatchiks could stop by if they were not too sensitive to the questionable hygiene and the wafting smell. They would also have to excuse the well-used, aluminum cutlery which was often fastened to tables by a chain to prevent theft, and would also have to tolerate the occasionally grimy plates, the warmed sausages with the mustard condiment splattered on a paper tray, and the beer served in flimsy paper cups.
